

The Lithuanian government has announced a two-week nationwide quarantine to stop the spread of the coronavirus. Lithuanian citizens currently abroad have been advised to return immediately.

The measures include closing borders to foreign nationals and shops except pharmacies and groceries.

Quarantine measures also include banning all public events, closing restaurants and shops, bars, excluding groceries and pharmacies. Client-servicing businesses, like beauty salons and hairdressers, will also need to close.

Two new coronavirus (COVID-19) cases have been confirmed. A Lithuanian student who arrived from Denmark has been diagnosed with the coronavirus. He was hospitalised in Klaipėda University Hospital.

Another coronavirus case has been confirmed in Vilnius. A man returned from Italy and is now being treated in isolation at Santara Clinics in Vilnius.

To date, 8 cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) confirmed in Lithuania.

All passengers arriving through Lithuania's three international airports will have their temperature measured and will have to fill out questionnaires.

Fourteen (14) day long self-isolation shall be mandatory to all travellers who arrive from high-risk countries and territories, identified as such by the decision of the Head of the National Emergency Operations Centre (Austria, China, Denmark, Egypt, France, Germany, Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China, Iceland, Iran, Italy, Japan, Netherlands, Norway, Singapore, South Korea, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland)*. Passengers arriving from the above mentioned countries and territories are required to submit personal information to the National Public Health Center (NVSC) by phone +370 5 2124098, by e-mail info@nvsc.lt
